A CATTLEYA ALLIANCE

- 101 Cattleya and Laelia species.
- 102 Cattleya Alliance species other than above. (e.g. Barkeria, Brassovola, Epidendrum, Sophronitis)
- 103 Cattleya Alliance hybrids which closely resemble their parent species.
- 104 Best grown plant from classes 101-103 (Rosette)
- 105 Best flower from classes 101-103 (Rosette)
- 106 Coerulea hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 107 Lavender, purple and pink hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 108 White, white with colored lip hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 109 Yellow, green and yellow with colored lip hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 110 Red, orange, bronze, art shades hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 111 Splash-petal, spots, patterns hybrids. (Flowers greater than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 112 Best grown plant from classes 106-111 (Rosette)
- 113 Best flower from classes 106-111 (Rosette)
- 114 Coerulea, lavender, purple and pink hybrids. (Flowers less than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 115 White, white with colored lip hybrids. (Flowers less than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 116 Yellow, green and yellow with colored lip hybrids (Flowers less than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 117 Red, orange, bronze and art shades hybrids. (Flowers less than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 118 Splash-petal, spots, patterns hybrids. (Flowers less than 4 inches or 10 cm in diameter.)
- 119 Best grown plant from classes 114-118 (Rosette)
- 120 Best flower from classes 114-118 (Rosette)

B CYPRIPEDIUM ALLIANCE

- 201 Cyripedium species and hybrids.
- 202 Paphiopedilum species from sections Parvisepalum and Brachypetalum
- 203 Paphiopedilum hybrids and from sections Parvisepalum and Brachypetalum.
- 204 Paphiopedilum multifloral species and hybrids. (At least 3 flowers open on 1 inflorescence.)
- 205 Paphiopedilum sequentially-blooming species and hybrids.
- 206 Paphiopedilum species - all others.
- 207 Paphiopedilum novelty hybrids (vinicolor and coloratum).
- 208 Paphiopedilum novelty hybrids - all other colors.
- 209 Paphiopedilum complex hybrids - (rounded flowers) - all colors.
- 210 Phragmipedium species.
- 211 Phragmipedium hybrids predominantly red (besseae and fischeri types).

C VANDA AND PHALAEOPSIS ALLIANCE, VANDACEOUS/AERANGIS/ANGRAECIDS

- 301 Angraecoid species.
- 302 Angraecoid hybrids and intergeneric hybrids, excluding Ascocenda.
- 303 Ascocenda hybrids - all colors.
- 304 Neofinetia falcata species and intergeneric hybrids.
- 305 Vanda species and hybrids other than above.
- 306 Allied general species and hybrids other than above - excluding Doritis, Phalaenopsis and Paraphalaenopsis.
- 307 Doritis, Phalaenopsis and Paraphalaenopsis species.
- 308 Best grown plant from classes 301-307 (Rosette)
- 309 Best flower from classes 301-307 (Rosette)
- 310 Solid white, may have color on lip - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm, excluding hybrids with venosa, violacea, amboinensis in their back ground.

- 311 White background with any markings - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm, excluding hybrids with venosa, violacea, amboinensis in their back ground.
- 312 Solid pink - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm, excluding hybrids with venosa, violacea, amboinensis in their back ground.
- 313 Pink with any markings - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm, excluding hybrids with venosa, violacea, amboinensis in their back ground.
- 314 Any other colors with any markings - Miniatures - flowers less than 6 cm, excluding hybrids with venosa, violacea, amboinensis in their back ground.
- 315 Base color yellow with any markings - Novelty - Hybrids with venosa, violacea or amboinensis.
- 316 Base color red with any markings - Novelty - Hybrids with venosa, violacea or amboinensis.
- 317 Solid reds or purples - Novelty - Hybrids with venosa, violacea or amboinensis.
- 318 All Colors - Harlequins - blotched or barred flowers of very heavy substance.
- 319 Solid white, may have yellow on lip - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 320 White with colored lip - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 321 White with pink markings, blushed, striped or spotted - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 323 White with any other color markings - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 327 Best grown plant from classes 310-326 (Rosette) (Don and Jane Grisham Memorial Award)
- 328 Best flower from classes 310-326 (Rosette)

D ONCIDIUM ALLIANCE

- 401 Brassia species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids resembling Brassia.
- 402 Odontoglossum species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 403 Miltonia and Miltoniopsis species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 404 Compariattia alliance species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 405 Tolumnia species and hybrids - all colors.
- 406 Oncidium species.
- 407 Oncidium Alliance species other than above.
- 408 Oncidium Alliance hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 409 Best grown plant from classes 401- 408 (Rosette)
- 410 Best flower from classes 401- 408 (Rosette)

E DENDROBIUM ALLIANCE

- 501 Miniatures - plants less than 4" tall - species, hybrids and intersectional hybrids.
- 502 Flowers resembling Phalaenopsis. (Phalaenanthe Section) species, hybrids and intersectional hybrids.
- 503 Antelope type flowers - all colors. (Spatulata Section) species, hybrids and intersectional hybrids.
- 504 Callista and Formosae (Nigrohirsuta Sections) species, hybrids and intersectional hybrids.
- 505 Nobile-type (Eugenanthe Section) species, hybrids and intersectional hybrids.
- 506 All sections and allied genera not listed above - species and hybrids.
- 507 Best grown plant from classes 501-506 (Rosette)
- 508 Best flower from classes 501-506 (Rosette)
- 601 Miniatures - plants less than 4" tall - species and hybrids.
- 602 Cymbidium and allied genera species and hybrids.
- 603 Catasetum, Cynoches, Gongora, Mormodes, Stanhopea and allied genera species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids.
- 604 Lycaste and Anguloa species and hybrids.
- 605 Zygopetalum species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 606 Maxillareae species, hybrids and intergeneric hybrids other than above.
- 607 Bulbophyllum and Cirrhopetalum species and hybrids.
- 608 Masdevallia and Dracula species.

G ORCHIDS IN USE - Orchids must be used in all of the following classes, but do not have to be grown by the exhibitor. Other non-floral material may be used. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used. Accessories are permitted.

- 701 Interpretive arrangement - showing originality.
- 702 Miniature arrangement - total height not to exceed 6 inches.
- 703 Corsage
- 704 Best use of orchids from classes 701-703 (Rosette)

H VANDA AND PHALAENOPSIS ALLIANCE, VANDACEOUS/AERANGIS/ANGRAECIDS

- 324 Pink solid color, may have white lip - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 325 Pink with any color markings - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 326 Yellow / green with any markings - Standard Phalaenopsis - flowers larger than 6 cm.
- 801 Best novice exhibit. First time Exhibitor Only. (Non-Commercial) - Dorothy R. Kaye Memorial Trophy
- 802 Best exhibit with flowers grown under lights.
- 803 Best exhibit, flowers grown on windowsills or sunroom.
- 804 Hobbyist, Small Greenhouse (150 square feet or less).
- 805 Hobbyist, Medium Greenhouse (151 to 400 square feet).
- 806 Hobbyist, Large Greenhouse (greater than 400 square feet).
- 807 Best group exhibit. (Two or more exhibitors.)
- 808 Best Society exhibit.
- 809 Best commercial exhibit.
- 810 Best educational exhibit.
- 811 Best orchid collectible exhibit.
- 812 Best orchid art created by the exhibitor (includes photography).
- 813 Best exhibit using 5 or fewer plants or cut inflorescence.
- 814 Best exhibit by a Not-For-Profit Publicly Supported Institution.
- 815 Best Display Exhibit (Includes plants not owned by exhibitor for qualified amount of time.)
- 816 Best Exhibit - Show Theme - "Orchid Roundup".

SPECIAL TROPHIES – NO ENTRY REQUIRED

Note: If in the opinion of the judges no exhibit merits the following trophies, the trophies will be withheld. It is not the intent that the awarding be obligatory.

Best Use of Show Theme

The DOS Spring 2011 Show has been approved for American Orchid Society judging. All flowers, whether entered for judging or not, will be considered for AOS awards unless otherwise marked by the exhibitor. If an inflorescence has previously been exhibited at an AOS function, it is considered to have already been screened, therefore, it is not eligible for further consideration. It should be marked "Not for AOS Judging". This will not disqualify the flower from consideration in the proper ribbon or trophy class.

American Orchid Society Show Trophy:

All certified AOS judges present, who are not involved in competition for the award, may vote by means of a secret written ballot. To qualify for the trophy, two-thirds of the voting judges must vote in favor of the same exhibit. If more than one-third of the voting judges vote "No Award", the trophy shall not be awarded. The exhibit that received the highest number of votes shall win the trophy. If a tie in votes exists between two or more exhibits, the chair of AOS judging, if eligible, shall cast the tie breaking vote. If the chair is not eligible to vote, a designated reserve judge shall break the tie. Further information is contained in 6.3.2 of the *AOS Handbook on Judging and Exhibition*.

To be eligible to receive this award a total of 80 points must be received:

General Arrangement	35 points maximum
Quality of Flowers	35 points maximum
Variety	20 points maximum
Labeling	10 points maximum

Orchid Digest Corporation Trophy:

This award is given to encourage the growing of better quality hybrids and species and to encourage their better culture.

The Orchid Digest Show Trophy may be awarded by a team consisting of a minimum of five judges, accredited where possible, to one non-commercial exhibit displaying the highest levels of:

- Artistry, taste, and innovation in design and presentation;
- Flower quality;
- Cultural excellence.

Judges may also consider the exhibit's educational value and rarity of plant materials. The definition of "high flower quality" is to be taken from the most recent edition of the AOS judging forms for hybrids and species.
